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Treatment of Japanese in California.

Hon. V. H. Metcalf.

States that had our treaty with
Japan, Supreme Court of California
would have unanimously held that
action of Board of Education of San
Francisco was in violation of treaty.
The Board declines to rescind reso-
lution, claiming that having estab-
lished a separate school for Indian
children and Mongolian or Chinese
children they are compelled under
mandatory provisions State law not
to admit them into any other school.
Telegraphed Sec'y State Nov. 1, ask-
ing him to point out clause upon
which Japan founds claim of dis-
crimination in education. Have
not yet received answer. Board willing to
submit case to Supreme Court on
agreed statement facts. Have mailed
full report upon this question. Now
examining question boycott of Japan-
ese restaurants and assaults upon
Japanese subjects. Will visit Jap-
anese club and personally in-
terview all Japanese who have made
complaints as to boycott or assault.
