I have examined the proposed statement of facts, which seems to be very clear and satisfactory, except that I suggest that the following amendments are desirable.

In paragraph 7 the words "that no educational facilities are denied to the children of said Oriental school" should be omitted. The facility

certainly denied to the children
of such Oriental school.

I do not suppose that
this is what the words
quoted were intended to
^{include} exclude, but they might
be held to ^{exclude} exclude it,
+ for any other purpose
they are quite unnecessary.
The whole ground is
covered in the other clauses
of the same article.

I think also the words
"in other schools" should
be added after the words
"American parentage" at
the end of paragraph 7.
This is for the same pur-
pose of avoiding possible
misconstruction.
