**PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT'S
MESSAGE AND AMERI-
CAN AMBASSADOR.**

With regard to the Message of President Roosevelt, a representative of the *Jiyu Tsushin* called on his Excellency Mr. Wright, the American Ambassador, to ascertain his views on the subject by a personal interview. His Excellency expressed himself frankly, saying, "American principles of justice and humanity are upheld by our President and our public opinion will do justice to Japan and the Japanese. The affair is being settled, as the Message of the President shows to be the case and I sincerely hope and trust that all men in Japan will understand thoroughly the best wishes of our Government towards your country for the ever increasing friendly relations between the two countries."
