Min. for F.A. referred in conversation today to apparent revival of anti-Japanese sentiment in San Francisco as shown by newspaper cables published here and asked me if, in view of this, I thought Japanese training ships should visit that port as intended. He stated also that ships sail to-day for Honolulu but could return from there if advisable. I replied that I thought there was no valid reason known to me for change of programme and that change might produce disagreeable impression both here and in the U.S., but that I would communicate with you. Kindly advise. (Rec'd. Jan. 6, 1907.)
