The Honorable

The Secretary of the Navy.

Sir:

I have the honor to quote for your information the following telegram, sent to the Ambassador at Tokyo on the 9th instant:

"We see no valid reason why the Japanese training ships should not visit the Pacific coast as planned. It may however be suggested that the serious derangements at San Francisco and to the naval depot there might hamper the naval authorities in extending to the visitors the courteous hospitality we should so greatly wish to show, while the prostrated condition of the city itself would tend to restrict shore leave."
