THE FIRST PUBLIC MEETING OF THE
"TAIBEI DOSHIKAI".

The first public meeting of the "Taibei Doshikai", held at 5:30 P. M. yesterday, at the Kinkikan, Kanda, was attended by some 1000 people. After the addresses by such men as Tagawa, Hinata and Hozumi, the following resolution was unanimously adopted. It is to be telegraphed this morning to the President of the United States.

"We, the citizens of Tokyo, regard the recent Amendment to the Immigration Act as an insult to the honor of the Japanese nation, and hold that it will destroy the cordial friendship existing between Japan and the United States. We have, therefore, unanimously decided to protest against it with all our power. We hope that the President will do his best to suspend it in practice."
