Treatment of Japanese in California.

Memorandum, May 25, 1907. (Encl. 204)

By the Third Assistant Secretary:

Stating that in view of the report in this morning's newspapers and of telegram, May 25, 1907, from Japan, he would suggest that a telegram should be sent to the Governor of California, in substance, as follows:

Advising of the telegram received from the American Ambassador to Japan, of newspaper reports, stating that the President is deeply impressed with the necessity of preventing ill treatment and violence to Japanese on the Pacific Coast, and asking the Governor to afford the necessary protection, also asking him to make a statement of the facts and as to the punishment of those guilty and of the explanations and amends which can be made.

When we hear from the Governor of California, we can probably send a soothing telegram to the Tokio Embassy.

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
