Meyer and myself visited Mr. Eimoto and he informed us that there had been no trouble at his place of business since the night of May 20th; and we also visited the Lion Restaurant, conducted by I. Kawai, at #124-8th St., and he informed us that the only trouble he had since May 20th was on the evening of May 21st, between the hour of 6 P. M. and 6:30 P. M. There were a few men gathered in front of his place of business and jeered at some of his customers, they then left without doing any damage to his place of business, and he also told us that yesterday evening at about 6 o'clock P. M., two men under the influence of liquor, entered his place, and demanded meals from him, he refused to serve them, and they left the place without causing any further trouble.
