I am desirous of transmitting as soon as possible, my report to the Attorney General, of the riotous assault upon the Japanese restaurants recently committed in San Francisco. I have taken down so far, the statements of all those I have been able to reach, and should like to have the statements of any more of the Japanese who were in the restaurant at the time of the assault, and who know the facts. As I do not know their addresses, or how to reach them, I shall take the liberty of asking you to have them call at my office so that their statements may be taken down and transmitted to Washington.

I desire to acknowledge receipt of your esteemed favor of May 28th, 1907, setting forth your views in relation to the assaults on the Japanese restaurants.
