Dear Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your communication dated May 7, 1907, in which you quote three cases of Japanese applicants for permits to conduct Intelligence Offices, and asking why their applications were refused by the Board of Police Commissioners.

In the case of K. Oda, #1721 Post Street, I will state that he filed an application to conduct an Intelligence Office at that address on November 19, 1906, and has never been refused or acted upon by the Board of Police Commissioners, on account of the applicant's failure to appear.

I am sending a notice to Mr. Oda to appear before the Board of Police Commissioners on May 14, 1907, so that action might be taken upon his application, which was filed upon the above date.

In the case of Y. Samejima, I beg to state that we have no record in this office of this party filing an application for a permit to conduct an Intelligence Office at #1908 Bush St.

Relative to your other interrogative, the case of H. Furuya, an Intelligence Keeper at the S/E cor. Fillmore and Sacramento Streets, I wish to state that Mr. Furuya failed to appear before the Board of Police Commissioners at its meeting on May 7, 1907, upon which date his application for renewal came up for hearing. The matter was continued to May 14, 1907, and I am sending him a notice under this date to appear at that time.
