THE "DAIDO" PARTY'S MANIFESTO.

The *Daido* party's council yesterday afternoon passed the following resolution and communicated it to the *Shimpoto*:-

"Japan and America are connected by friendly relations which are historic, and public opinion of both countries admits that their co-operation is indispensable for the propagation of civilization and preservation of peace in Eastern Asia.

"A section of rowdies in the Pacific coast of America has insisted on committing outrages on our compatriots, in violation of laws of their own country. Their riotous propensity knows no end. We are aware that the United States President and nation, being guided by the principles of justice and humanity, regret and are ashamed of the occurrence of such events. At the same, we deeply regret that our Government, on account of its negligence and temporizing methods, has failed to take appropriate measures.

"In view of current affairs in the Far East, and of the friendly relations existing between these two countries, we urge the Government to work for a speedy and stable solution of the question and hope that the just President and nation of our neighbouring country will justify our trust in them."
