SAN FRANCISCO AFFAIR.

RENEWED PERSECUTION.

A San Francisco telegram states that the San Francisco City Office has suspended the Japanese from keeping an intelligence office. It is believed all Japanese trade, except that of selling merchandise, will be suspended.

In San Francisco, there are about 300 Japanese shops, of which only about 50 engage in the selling trade. Others are restaurants, bath-houses, laundries, barbers, lodging houses, etc. If the above telegram be true, the order will render idle a majority of the Japanese in San Francisco.
