Sir:

Referring to previous correspondence concerning intelligence office licenses in San Francisco, I have the honor to say that I have received to-day a telegram from the United States Attorney there, as follows:

Further answering telegram Russell, Acting Attorney General, Japanese license cases, -of women, six were born in United States, one was born in Ireland. Father of last named came to America when she was an infant and was naturalized. She came when at the age of eighteen or nineteen. Of six men mentioned in former telegram as not seen five are out of business and cannot be located and other one is out of town and will not return till next Monday. One holding first papers is Englishman. Information to refusal of intelligence office or other licenses to other foreigners and American citizens must be obtained from secretary of city police commission, who has promised to furnish it at earliest possible moment. When received, will be telegraphed at once. Will probably be two or three days.
