THE AMERICAN AFFAIR.

(From Premier Saionji's Interview with the Delegates
of the Progressives.)

Since the nature of the restaurant mobbing at San Francisco was such that it could not be regarded as a subject of international dispute, a lawyer has been selected to file a claim for damages. The rejection of application for licenses of employment agencies was, however, said the Premier, a distinct case of infringement of the treaty right of residence, and the Japanese Government had made a representation to the American Government in the earlier part of this month. The Premier is also reported to have stated that the object of Director Ishii's mission was not only to visit the United States, but also to investigate the conditions of immigration in Mexico, Canada, etc.
