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TELEGRAMS FROM MR. MATSUBARA, IN CHARGE OF THE JAPANESE
CONSULATE AT SAN FRANCISCO.

San Francisco, September 19th, 1907.

The question of granting licenses to Japanese applicants for running intelligence offices is expected to be considered at the executive meeting of the Board of Police Commissioners tonight.

San Francisco, September 20, 1907.

No decision was reached on the matter of licenses at the meeting of Police Commissioners held last evening. I understand that the Secretary of the Board was instructed to ascertain and report the views of the United States District Attorney upon the subject. Action of Police Commissioners has thus been postponed at least for a week.
